It is too easy to take this kind of service for granted. We have seen in these short years a steady increase in ticket sales, expanding types and quality of prizes, and proceeds available to club. Much work has gone into it.

Tim has served in this capacity for an extra year already, having expressed his desire to step down a year ago (after three full years' service) and extra kudos are due him for his willingness to carry on for this fourth year. The process and system has been honed and can be continued without re-inventing the wheel from this year on.

Our annual membership dues have been raised to \$75 by unanimous vote of the attending

membership at the November 10th meeting, on recommendation from the Board, who voted unanimously to present as necessary to cover the club's annual operating expenses. Previously, dues' shortfalls have been covered by proceeds from the Lottery. The matter has been in consideration and budgets studied for over 2 years, leading to this action as necessary to keep the club solvent and moving on debt-free. This allows the club to cover annual operating and maintenance expenses freeing up fundraising proceeds (Lottery, et al) to be applied directly to upgrades and new initiatives.

Music buffs, the hint is the picture to your left. The question is simply this—who was the first person to run for and win the Vice Presidency of the United States? For our first few elections, the Vice Presidency went to the person who got the second most votes for President. Could you imagine that today? As my younger cousin might say—"AWK-WARRRD!"
