TRIVIA

First of all, last month's question: Firearms are generally based on the principle of accelerating a projectile (a bullet) through the use of an explosive (gunpowder) to eventually project energy onto a target. However, let us talk about ways of projecting energy without the use of a projectile, and ways of accelerating a projectile without the use of an explosive. Here are four technologies currently being tested by the military which either eliminates the projectile or the explosive. See if you know what they do....



"Active Denial System" - Afghanistan, 2010

Answer: The Active Denial System projects energy at its target, using principles very similar to a microwave oven. It uses a different wavelength, only penetrating the topmost layers of skin, creating a feeling of intense heat, reaching a pain threshold within 3 seconds, with no test subjects able to stand it more than 5 seconds.



"Laser Avenger System"

Answer: An infrared laser system which has already been used to shoot down test Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (USAV).



"Personnel Halting and Stimulation Response" (PHASR) Rifle

Answer: While blinding lasers are banned under a 1995 treaty, this one is not, because it uses a laser to "dazzle," only causing temporary blindness.



Electromagnetic Projector (aka "Rail Gun")

Answer: Using electromagnetic current to accelerate a projectile, the rail gun, using no gunpowder or propellants, can accelerate a projectile to enormous speeds, far exceeding the muzzle velocity of current weaponry.
